



CLINICAL CASE:

A 55-year-old woman (60kg) with a history of Mediterranean fever, chronic kidney disease, depression, vertebral arthrosis, and hypercholesterolemia was admitted for self-poisoning. She had recently been treated for tracheobronchitis with acetaminophen and clarithromycin, and had taken ketoconazole for a vaginal infection. At 8:00 pm, she called her sister to report ingesting Colchicine 30mg, Tramadol 750mg, Venlafaxine 1.5g, and Pravastatin 400mg two hours prior and presented with diffuse abdominal pain, vomiting, and diarrhea upon admission. At 10:00 pm, she presented Glasgow coma score 13; BP 90/50mmHg, HR 120/min; RR 13/min, SpO2 95% on room air. Physical examination showed tender abdomen and normal cardiothoracic auscultation
